The 20th Annual “Day of Commitment to Eliminate Racism,” cosponsored by the NAACP and YWCA, was held on September 16, 2016 at the YWCA St. Joseph. Over 75 attended the breakfast event. Loes Hedge served as the emcee for the event, and Rev. Dr. Bill Hedge gave the opening prayer. Mayor Bill Falkner read a special proclamation and Jeannette James told the history of the Kelsy Beshears Racial Justice Award.

Students from the Central High School Diversity Student Union and children from the St. Francis

Baptist Temple participated with the program.

Charles Triplett, president of NAACP, gave out community service awards to: Clarence Green, Chief of Police, Northwest Missouri State University; Latoya Fitzpatrick, Multicultural Education Center at Missouri Western State University; and the Missouri Highway Patrol, Troop H.
